He conducted telephone link ups with the Magistrates court when solicitors did bail applications for clients.

His love of horses the enjoyment of training, riding his race horses and winning many trophies and prizes. He adored mare "Fine Moon Maiden" who won the cup at the Beltana races last year. Oola enjoyed Slim Dusty music was a supporter of Adelaide Crows football team.

He adored his children very much and would take a group of children swimming, fishing and horse riding lessons. He was well liked at the Port Augusta Stables. He attended Church and made a commitment to Jesus Christ. David was cheerful, always a caring, loving father. He was loved by many relatives and friends and respected by all who knew him.
